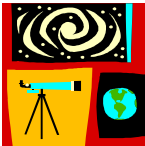
Hubert Middle School 21st CCLC Chorus Musical Extravaganza

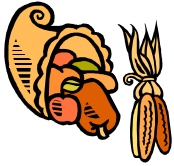

DEAR Day at Port Wentworth Elementary School

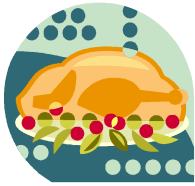

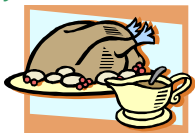
Largo-Tibet's Annual Thanksgiving Feast

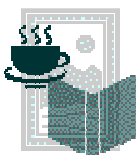
Largo-Tibet's Jr. Beta Club Decorates Holiday Tress

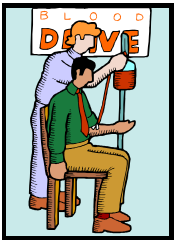
East Broad Elementary's Stroll Down Veterans Alley
