

What is a Family/Parent-School Compact?

A Family/Parent-School Compact is an agreement that parents, students, and teachers develop together. It explains how parents and teachers will work together to make sure all of our students reach grade-level standards. It provides strategies to help connect learning at school and at home.

Effective Compacts:

- Link to goals of the school improvement plan
- Focus on student learning skills
- Describe how teachers will help students develop those skills using high-quality instruction
- Share strategies parents can use at home
- Explain how teachers and parents will communicate about student progress
- Describe opportunities for parents to volunteer, observe, and participate in the classroom

Jointly Developed

The parents, students and staff of Garden City Elementary developed this Family/Parent-School Compact for Achievement. Teachers suggested home learning strategies, an Annual Survey was conducted to gain parent feedback, and students told us what would help them learn. A Parent Forum is held each year to review the Compact and make changes based on student needs.

Building Partnerships and Communication

Garden City Elementary School offers ongoing events and programs to provide parents and students with access to our staff and to promote communication between school and home –

- Open House
- Curriculum and Assessment Family Nights
- Parent Resource Center (Monday-Friday)
- Teachers will share Lexile reading scores and MAP math assessment scores with parents after each testing window.
- The school encourages all parents to sign up for Parent Access: PowerSchool to stay up to date on their children's academic progress.
- Teachers are available to meet with parents before and after school. Please schedule an appointment with your child's teacher.
- Parents may call and leave a message for teachers during instructional time or email at any time. Visit the school's website for email information.
- Parent conference will be conducted during the year where the compact is shared/discussed with families.

Family Engagement

- Parents can schedule classroom observations.
- Parents are encouraged to speak with teachers regarding ways they can volunteer at school.
- Teachers will request family volunteerism in their classrooms as needed (classroom helper, reading buddy, library helper, etc.)
- Families will be encouraged to volunteer during school-wide events (Read Across America events, book fairs, PTA, etc.)
- Families will use the SCCPSS Volunteer Tracker by app-garden to register to volunteer.

- provide math resources/information to promote student growth (flashcards to reinforce multiplication and division facts).



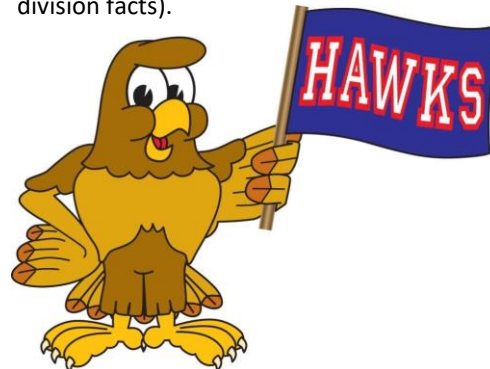
At home, parents will...

- read 20 minutes daily using materials provided by my teacher and track what I read on my reading log.
- use math resources/information provided by the teacher to complete work at home (flashcards to reinforce multiplication and division facts).
