How Will We Communicate?

It is very important for the school and parents to communicate on a regular basis in order to build the bridge between school and home. At Haven we will communicate by:

Teaming Up for Success: School, Parents, Students



School input in student success is the third leg of the success triangle. The school team and parents decided the following were needed from the school to help insure success:

- ◆ Provide materials for students to take home to read on their reading level. Work with students on reading skills in a small group and individual setting.
- ◆ The teacher will provide the students with notes and examples for their notebooks which can be used for assistance at home with parental support with addition, subtraction, multiplication, division, decimals & fractions.
- ◆ Provide study guides to use at home to

Parents joined Haven staff to develop a list of actions to support student success.

- ◆ Read aloud with my child for at least 30 minutes daily.
- ◆ Parents will assist student with studying new and previously taught concepts, (addition, subtraction, multiplication, division, decimals & fractions), by using notes and examples from notebooks provided by the teacher.
- ◆ Review reading study guides and help my child prepare for assessments.

Students play the biggest role in their own success. 5th graders gave ideas and feedback about what was important to them to be successful in school. Students gave the following ideas:

- ◆ I will read every night for 30 minutes.
- ◆ I will learn and study every day, at school and home new and previously taught concepts in math using notes and examples from the notebook provided by the teacher.
- ◆ I will complete and review my study guides at home with an adult.
